EOUESTRIAN CANADA STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES

The health and welfare of horses in Canada is of the highest priority for Equestrian Canada (EC) and the Canadian equestrian industry and community we serve.

EC supports adherence to the humane treatment of horses in all activities under our jurisdiction. Under the EC Statement of Principles, all persons shall be committed to:

- Upholding the welfare of all horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities.
- Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and compassion, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment.
- Ensuring that all equestrians, including owners, trainers and competitors, or their respective agents, use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their own horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose.
- Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure.
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare.
- Requiring owners, trainers and competitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions.
- Actively promoting the development of, and adherence to, competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

2024 EQUESTRIAN CANADA AMENDMENTS & RULE CHANGES:

Some rules on this page have been summarized or not fully transcribed. Please refer to the EC Rules for the complete text and context. The notes below are only meant to assist in alerting competitors to changes. The EC Rules govern.

This is not a comprehensive list of all the changes, many changes are of an updating or clarifying nature. Competitors are responsible for knowing and following all of the rules.

EQUESTRIAN CANADA AMENDMENTS DRESSAGE (SECTION E) 2024:

Article 9.9 - 10.

When there is only one horse in a class, ribbons and prizes shall be awarded in accordance with the following chart of percentages:

- 1st63% or higher
- 2nd60% to 62.9%
- 3rd..... 58% to 59.9%
- No ribbons or prizes shall be awarded below 3rd position

GENERAL RULES & CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

EQUESTRIAN CANADA RULES: Please use 2024 EC Dressage Rules in conjunction with 2024 EC General Regulations.

Every class offered herein is covered by the Rules and Specifications of the current (2024) rules of Equestrian Canada and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book

Per Article **A801**, every entry at an EC sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver, rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competitions. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in these EC sanctioned competitions in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition.

All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations.

CURRENT DRESSAGE TESTS: ALL dressage tests are available from **www.equestrian.ca/sport/dressage/tests** or **www.fei.org** for download. Western Dressage will use the current WSDAC tests available at **www.westernstyledressage.ca.**

DIRECTIONS & PARKING: For arrival and departure of trailers and parking for competitors and visitors see signage onsite.

EQUESTRIAN CANADA MEDICATION CONTROL: Gold, Bronze and Familiarization competition entries are required to follow Equestrian Canada Medication Control Rules. A mandatory drug testing fee will be charged for each horse entered in the competition (\$4.00 Bronze, \$8.00 Gold). Any horse, entered in an EC competition, may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location. (A602.5)

ENTRIES: Only on-line entries or email entries will be accepted. All required memberships MUST be renewed before you submit your show entry form. Proof of negative Coggins, and a signed waiver form MUST be submitted to the show manager along with your payment and entry form in order to validate your entries. Electronic signatures will be accepted in 2024. For subsequent competitions in 2024 which you enter these documents will be kept on file. New waivers will only be required if a horse/rider combination change. Saskatoon Dressage Club accepts, Western Dressage, or Regina Dressage Club memberships in lieu of a Saskatoon Dressage Club membership, or memberships from dressage clubs based in other provinces (for competitors coming in from out of province). No competitor will be allowed to ride without the completed documentation. Failure to check in at the show office will result in elimination from the class or warm up ride. No refunds will be given. Entries will be processed on a first come, first served basis as the show is limited to 8 hours of judging per day.

Every entry shall further constitute an undertaking that: a) every horse, rider or driver is eligible as entered; and b) the owners, lessees and any of their representatives agree to be bound by the constitution and rules of Equestrian Canada and the competition, to accept as final the decision of the EC Board of Directors on any question arising under said rules, and agree to hold the competition, EC, their officials, directors, and employees harmless for any action.

WAIVERS: All entries must be accompanied by a Waiver of Liability duly signed and dated by the appropriate person (rider, owner, parent/guardian and person responsible). Electronic signatures will be accepted.

COGGINS TEST: Proof of a negative Coggins Test within the last six months will be required for the 2024 competition season and MUST be submitted along with the entry form for your entry to be valid. No horse will be allowed on the competition grounds without prior proof of a negative result.

EQUINE VACCINATIONS: All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have been administered Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus (1&4) vaccinations within 6 months (+21 days grace period) before arrival at the event. No horse shall receive vaccination within 7 days prior to arrival at the event. Horses not in compliance with this rule will not be allowed on the competition grounds. The frequency of vaccine administration should be as recommended by the vaccine manufacturer or veterinarian. It is recommended that vaccines be administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccines, a letter from a veterinarian on official letterhead must be provided with the entry form, stating the horse cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns. At the discretion of competition management, a log of the horse's temperature prior to arrival at the competition grounds or during the event can be requested. (**Article A519**)

VACCINATION CERTIFICATION: All entry forms must be signed and dated by the Person responsible. Electronic signatures will be accepted in 2024.

DEFINITION OF PERSON RESPONSIBLE: The Person(s) responsible (PR) for a horse must be an adult who has, or shares responsibility for the care, training, custody, and performance of the horse and who has official responsibility for that horse under EC Rules. The PR is liable under the penalty provisions of the applicable EC Rules for any rule violations. Every entry form for an EC sanctioned competition must identify the PR and be signed by the PR. The Person(s) responsible is ultimately responsible for the condition, fitness and management of the horse and is alone responsible for any act performed by himself/herself or by any other person with authorized access to the horse in the stables, elsewhere on the grounds, or while the horse is being ridden, driven or exercised. A: For adult entries into EC sanctioned competitions the PR shall be either the trainer, the owner of the horse or the competitor who rides or drives the horse during the EC sanctioned competition. B: For Junior entries into EC sanctioned competitions the Junior competitor cannot be the PR. For Junior entries the PR may be either the trainer, the owner of the horse, or a parent/guardian of the Junior competitor.

CROSS-ENTERING: More than one athlete may ride the same horse/pony at a competition providing the horse/pony is not entered by two athletes in the same class. The athletes can both be juniors or amateur/open or any mixture of these providing they are not in the same class unless the class is divided into separate

categories for the purpose of ribbons. The horse/pony must not compete against itself. An athlete may enter classes run under different licenses at one competition providing the rider has the requisite sport license/Horse Recording or EC National Passport. e.g., A rider may compete in gold/bronze, silver/gold etc. classes at one competition.

HORS CONCOURS ENTRIES: A hors concours entry in a freestyle must have qualified to ride the freestyle. Hors concours entries are not eligible for any placings, prizes, or awards. A horse may compete as a hors concours and competitive entry at the same competition. Hors concours entries are not permitted in the Provincial Championship competition.

LIMIT OF ENTRIES, TIME CHANGES AND CLASS CANCELLATION: The Show Manager for Saskatoon Dressage Club reserves the right to limit entries, limit tack stalls, combine or cancel classes, alter ring sizes, change designated rings, decide on any point not covered by the rules, and correct any errors or make any necessary changes to the prize list or program during the course of the competition year. Competitors will be notified at the earliest possible time of any changes. The onus will be upon the competitor to familiarize themselves with such changes. In the event of inclement weather, the Show Manager will do their best to reschedule classes. Should that not be possible no refunds will be given for canceled classes.

FAMILIARIZATION: Horses may be entered in the bronze competition for familiarization only at a cost of entry fees: (Administration fee, bronze drug testing fee, Dressage Canada levy, SHF levy, stabling, and SDC daily use fee.) No classes need be entered. Familiarization entries are subject to the same conditions as regular entries. Consideration to competitors must be given i.e., if your horse is causing a disruption, please remove it from the competition area. Numbers must be worn at all times when a horse/pony is outside its stall.

WESTERN DRESSAGE: Classes offered will be Junior and Open only using WSDA of Canada tests. Ribbons will be awarded through fourth place and show Championship ribbons and Prizes and Reserve Championship ribbons will be awarded.

STABLING AND TACK STALLS: Stabling fees will be charged per horse and stalls will be assigned. For the security of all competitors DO NOT change your stall assignment without approval from the show office. Stalls must display emergency contact information for each horse (Owner/Person Responsible/Trainer, veterinarian). Stabling fees do not include the final cleaning of the stall and will not include any shavings. Please pre-order your shavings on the entry form at a price of \$12 per bag (Minimum order 2 bags). Additional shavings will be available for purchase – please see the show office. At the end of the competition stalls must be stripped or will be charged a surcharge of \$50 per stall as per SDC rules. This extra cleaning fee will be invoiced after the competition. Failure to pay the extra cleaning fee will result in the

competitor becoming a member not in good standing. Tack stalls are advised as new bio security rules prohibit storing hay or any equipment in the aisles.

CANCELLATION: Competitors canceling before the competition entry closing date will be refunded all fees minus the administration fee. Competitors canceling after the competition entry closing date but before the start of the competition will only be refunded their fees minus the administration fee upon receipt of a veterinarian's certificate for the horse or a doctor's certificate for the rider. Competitors canceling after the start of the competition will only be refunded fees for classes not ridden upon receipt of a veterinarian's certificate for the horse or a doctor's certificate for the rider. Documentation must reach the Show Manager within 14 days of the last day of the competition.

COACHING: Any person coaching at an EC sanctioned competition must be an EC Licensed Coach or eligible for EC Temporary Coaching status. Their number must be listed on the entry form. Any competitor that does not have an EC Licensed Coach/EC Temporary Coach on site at the competition must declare they are self-coached and no person is allowed to coach them either during warm ups or during the competition. A Junior cannot declare they are self-coached however their parent or guardian can be named. When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries, must be in good-standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments.

REPORTING FOR COMPETITION: All competitors MUST report to the show office upon arrival and before riding to confirm that all is in order with your paperwork and pay any fees owing. Failure to do so will result in elimination from either your warm up ride or your class and no refunds will be given. For security reasons we also need to know which horses are on the grounds and ensure that we have the correct contact information. The show office is open from 12 noon until after the last warm up ride on Saturday, and opens one hour before the competition starts on Sunday until the last ride of the day is completed. For those arriving Saturday afternoon, please report to the show office as early as you can. This will allow those who arrive later Saturday evening or early Saturday morning a chance to sign in and give the show office more time Sunday morning to prepare for the judges and set up for the competition. Only one person at a time allowed at the show office, other than a junior, who may be accompanied by a parent or guardian.

NUMBERS: Must be worn and visible at all times when any horse/pony is outside of its stall. This requirement includes familiarization horses. Numbers will not be available for purchase at the show office.

SHOW SCHEDULE: Warm-ups will be available starting at 1pm on Saturday and half an hour before the start of competition on Sunday. DO NOT warm up until the Stewards are on site. Competitions generally start around 9:00 am on Sunday and continue until completion of the classes based on entries. In the event of changes to the schedule (e.g., due to scratches), day sheets will be posted daily in the morning of competition. These sheets will inform all competitors of the most current and correct order of go and will override previous scheduling. It is the competitors' responsibility to check for any possible changes.

SUBSTITUTION FEES: There will be a \$10 fee for substituting a horse and/or rider competition entry after the entry closing date but before the competition has started. After the competition has started any changes to a rider or horse will be considered a new entry, a new number will be issued and all appropriate fees must be paid. New entry forms and waivers must be signed and memberships or temporary memberships must be in place.

WARM UP: Horses may be schooled only in designated areas. DO NOT ride until the Stewards are on site. Whips, running martingales, boots and bandages are allowed for schooling only. Only mounted riders are allowed in the warm up rings. Horses may only be ridden in the competition rings on Friday provided a half hour block of time has been purchased (see warm up ride request form).

LUNGEING: Lunging is not permitted in an area where horses are being ridden. Lunging (unmounted) and work in hand can only be done by the rider, owner, coach, groom or person responsible. For lunging equipment rules, see **(E4.9).** It is not permitted to lunge riders at any competition, whether or not the horse is entered in the competition. Lunging is permitted only in designated areas if space permits. Please speak with the show manager about options for lunging.

CONFLICT OF INTEREST: It is the responsibility of the rider not to enter a class or ride in front of a judge from whom he/she has been instructed, coached or tutored with or without pay the 30 days immediately prior to the date of the competition.

CALLERS: A caller for tests will not be provided. Competitors should therefore make their own arrangements. All EC tests may be called during the competition except FEI, Freestyles and tests at gold championships when all tests must be ridden from memory (exception for E 14.9 Masters Test of Choice). Caller's dress code: smart casual; jeans, slacks and mid length shorts are permitted. Inappropriately dressed callers may not be allowed to call a test; tank tops and short shorts are prohibited. Callers may not wear personal electronic devices, e.g., Bluetooth, headphones, etc. while calling tests except for the exceptions listed in Section E Article 9.1.5.

SAFETY HEADGEAR: All riders, regardless of age or level of competition, must wear properly fitted and fastened safety approved protective headgear at all times

when mounted at any EC-sanctioned Dressage competition at the event location. **Note:** At the tack check, which follows the test, the steward may ask the rider to dismount so that the helmet may be inspected for the safety standard labeling.

STEWARD PRESENTATION: Tack checks will be in place for 2024. Each competitor in the competition is responsible for presenting their horse to the steward, if required, for inspection immediately after they have completed their test and leave the competition arena. A rider who is eliminated or retires during a test must still report to the steward for a tack check, if required. Any discrepancy to the saddlery or dress rules found by the steward will result in elimination. Failure to report to the steward, if required, will result in elimination.

HORSES may not be removed from the show grounds until they have completed their last class of the day.

RIBBONS AND AWARDS: All competition ribbons for classes can be picked up with tests throughout the day at the show office on Sunday. Champion prizes/ribbons and Reserve Champion ribbons can be picked up after the completion of the show on Sunday afternoon.

LIABILITY: It is a condition of entry that neither Saskatoon Dressage Club, Saskatchewan Horse Federation, Equestrian Canada and any of their officials, volunteers, officers, directors, agents, representatives, employees and the owners and occupiers of the land upon which these competitions are held will be responsible for any liabilities or claims of any nature and kind which may arise from participation in these events. Waivers must be signed by the competitor, person responsible and their parent/guardian (in the case of a junior), as well as the horses' legal owner before the start of the competition. Electronic signatures are accepted in 2024.

DOGS: Dogs are discouraged. They are not permitted near riding areas. These are the only animals, other than horses or ponies, permitted on the competition grounds. They must be under control, quiet, and on a leash (no expanding leashes) at all times. Due to new bio security rules dogs are NOT allowed in any of the buildings at the facility. Please pick up after your dog.

NO PHONE, FAX OR MAIL ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED: All entry forms, Coggins tests, and signed waivers MUST be received by midnight of the closing date. Either print, complete and email your entry form or use the online entry option. Payment can then be made by e transfer (No checks accepted) Late entries may be accepted for a late entry fee of \$25, and **only** if space permits and the late entry can be accommodated within the time parameters of scheduling.

PAYMENT: All entries (whether emailed or submitted online) must be accompanied by a payment of the appropriate fees either by e transfer for your entry to be valid.

PRIZES AND AWARDS

Ribbons are awarded to third place. Any horse receiving less than 40% of the total points obtainable in a test will be eliminated from that class. Any horse receiving less than 50% of the total points obtainable in a test shall not be eligible for awards, ribbons or prizes.

 - No ribbons or prizes shall be awarded below 3rd position

Thoroughbred Incentive Program: An award will be presented to the shows High Point Thoroughbred registered in the TIP. TIP number must be included on the entry form.

SDC is offering warm-up rides in Ring 1 (competition area) on the Saturday prior to competition. Half-hour blocks of time will be available at a cost of \$40.00. Use of Ring 2 & 3 is NOT allowed without purchasing a warm-up slot.

To comply with Equestrian Canada rules, all competitors must have the opportunity to purchase warm-up times. Each horse/rider combination is only allowed ONE half hour time slot to allow all competitors to have the opportunity to purchase time. If there are time slots open after the entry deadline, riders may purchase additional time slots (enquire with Show Manager sdcshowemail@gmail.com).

ALL RIDERS MUST REPORT TO THE SHOW OFFICE BEFORE RIDING. FAILURE TO DO SO WILL RESULT IN ELIMINATION FROM THE WARM UP RIDE. NO REFUNDS WILL BE GIVEN.
